Vehicles, Pedestrians & Traffic Management

- Maximum speed limit 20 km/h
- All visitors must adhere to the traffic management plan keeping to marked roadways only
- Be aware of other vehicles, pedestrians and ship working activities on the terminal – Tugmasters always have right of way
- Pedestrians must only use marked walkways and crossings
- A minimum distance of 2m from the quayside must be maintained at all times
- Personal media players, mobile phones, CB radios etc. **must not** be used whilst on the terminal

PPE

The following must be worn at all times

- High visibility clothing
- Safety footwear
- Safety helmet (where appropriate and as indicated)

Fire

In the event of a fire please raise the alarm by contacting a member of staff and proceed to the muster point located at the freight office main entrance.

- The terminal is a **NO SMOKING** area
- Permits are required for any hot work
- Any spillages of flammable liquids must be reported immediately
- Stowage of hazardous goods must be in accordance with the terminal plan which indicates appropriate areas

First Aid

There are trained first aiders on site. If you or someone with you is injured or unwell please contact a member of staff for assistance.

Contractors

- Contractors & visitors are not permitted to access the terminal without first obtaining authorisation
- Contractors must not operate vehicles or equipment which they have not been trained and authorised to use
- All contractors must hold a valid licence for any vehicles or equipment they use
- A “permit to work” scheme is in operation for high risk activities
- Copies of risk assessments, work procedures etc. will be required prior to the commencement of any work
- Contractors must abide by Seatruck Ferries health and safety rules and procedures (guidelines available)
- All work areas must be kept clean and tidy and all rubbish removed from site once work is completed
- A life jacket must be worn at all times when working near water
